Faculty

Dr Nigel Barwood

Dr. Nigel Barwood graduated from UWA with honours in 1991. Following general surgical training, he was awarded FRACS in 1999. Dr. Barwood has completed Fellowship at the Royal Infirmary in Edinburgh and Melbourne, both as part of the CSSANZ post Fellowship training programme. Dr. Barwood returned to Perth in 2003 as a colorectal surgeon at Fremantle Hospital and relocated to Fiona Stanley Hospital in 2014. He was involved with the introduction of laparoscopic colorectal surgery to WA. Dr. Barwood’s private practice is based at St John of God Murdoch Hospital, where he is currently Head of Department of General Surgery. Dr. Barwood is currently a supervisor of surgical training at FSH and is a past Chairman of the Board in General Surgery in WA.



Dr Abraham Jacob

Dr Jacob graduated from the University of Tasmania, where he graduated with Honours in 2007. Following this he trained in General Surgery at the Royal Melbourne Hospital, gaining experience in general surgery including trauma and transplant surgery. Dr Jacob was made a Fellow of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons in 2015 and underwent further training in Colorectal Surgery through Colorectal Surgeons Society of Australia and New Zealand (CSSANZ) at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Adelaide and Fiona Stanley Hospital in Perth. Dr Jacob has a particular interest in minimally invasive techniques in colorectal surgery. He also has an interest in pelvic floor disorders and has additional training for Sacral Nerve Modulation for faecal incontinence.
